# The Fourth Sunday of Easter, Year A

## First Reading: Sirach 15:1-6

¹The one who reveres the Holy One will do this, the one who embraces the law will embrace Wisdom. ²She will come to meet them like a mother, and like a young woman in innocence she will welcome them. ³She will feed them with the bread of understanding, and the water of wisdom she will give them to drink. ⁴They will be supported by her and not fall, and will attend her and not be put to shame. ⁵She will exalt them above their neighbors, and in the midst of the assembly she will open their mouths. ⁶Joy and a crown of gladness will they find, and an everlasting name will be their lot.

#### Psalm: Psalm 119:97-103

97How I love your teaching!
All day it is my meditation.
98Your commandment makes me wiser than my enemies,
for it is always with me.
99I have more understanding than all my instructors,
for your decrees are my meditation.
100I understand more than the aged,
for I observe your precepts.
101I restrain my feet from every evil way,
in order to keep your word.
102From your decrees I do not turn away,
for you have taught me.
103How sweet are your words to my taste,
sweeter than honey to my mouth!

## **Second Reading: Romans 6:5-11**

<sup>5</sup>For if we have been united in a death like Christ's, we will certainly be so in the resurrection. <sup>6</sup>This we know, that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin. <sup>7</sup>The woman or man who has died is freed from sin. <sup>8</sup>But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him. <sup>9</sup>We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die; death no longer has dominion over him. <sup>10</sup>For dying, he died once to sin; in living, he lives to God. <sup>11</sup>So also should you consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

### Gospel: Matthew 22:23-33

<sup>23</sup>The same day [that Jesus taught about taxes] some Sadducees came to him, saying there is no resurrection; and they questioned him, saying, <sup>24</sup>"Teacher, Moses said, 'If a man dies without having children, his brother shall marry the [widow] woman, and raise up offspring for his brother.' <sup>25</sup>Now there were seven brothers among us; the first married, and without having offspring, leaving the woman to his brother. <sup>26</sup>The same for the second, and the third, to the seventh. <sup>27</sup>After everything the woman died. <sup>28</sup>In the resurrection, then, for which of the seven will she be wife? For they all had her."

<sup>29</sup>Jesus answered them, "You all are wrong, because you know neither the scriptures nor the power of God. <sup>30</sup>For in the resurrection they neither marry nor are given in marriage, rather they are like angels in heaven. <sup>31</sup>And about the resurrection of the dead, have you all not read what was said to you by God, <sup>32</sup>'I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob'? God is God not of the dead, but of the living." <sup>33</sup>And when the crowd heard it, they were astounded at his teaching.
