How will you respond God's call to walk in love this year? How will you decide to share your gifts with God's people in the world?

The secret, the surprise, is that the most miraculous gift has been with us all along. All that is asked of us is to pay attention to it, tap into it, and grow with it. Love walks this journey with us, our steps along this path are counted by our generosity of heart, Spirit, and treasure. I invite you to *Walk in Love*.
